Instructions for putting this book together if you have downloaded it from the website.

Print all pages on good inkjet paper or glossy photo paper so colors are bright.

Buy a package of clear sheet protectors

Put 2 sheets back to back in a sheet protector and cut in half on dotted line. (This works great if you have a paper cutter) You may have to do single sheets if you are cutting by hand. You only need 11 clear sheet protectors.

Then rearrange half sheets so Jesus is on the back of cover sheet, me is on back of love, etc.

You will need to punch an extra hole so you have two holes. Punch through where some of them already have a hole. Secure the song together with metal rings. Pages will turn easily.

To the Nursery Teacher or Parent:

This book has been designed for you to turn the pages as you point to each word. Your child will learn to read the words through repetition.

I used the King James Version of The Lord's Prayer because this is what we pray in church. Wouldn't it be a joy to have our little children saying it with us. Perhaps now that you know the concept you can make additional flash cards for the words you use to describe prayer and God. There are no pictures on the pages because that distracts the baby from focusing on the word. Words are in different colors and fonts to help keep their attention.

The fastest learning period in a child's life is between birth and 2 1/2 years old. During this time 10's of thousands of brain connections are being formed. By interaction with your baby and teaching them to read you are strengthening those connections for their lifetime. The first 50 words a baby learns to read need lots of repetition as they come very slow but after that they get on the fast track to learning so enjoy interacting with your baby and don't give up.
